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ADRENALINE AUTO-INJECTORS CHANGE

Change of Formulary Auto-Injectors

In Tayisde, EpiPen[®] has been the first choice adrenaline auto-injector, with Jext[®] an alternative. There is now an adrenaline auto-injector which is a similar price that provides a 500microgram dose of adrenaline. As per the Emerade[®] manufacturer's Summary of Product Characteristics (SPC), the 500microgram dose <u>may be used for adults or adolescents over 60kg body-weight, depending on clinical judgement</u>. The 500microgram Emerade[®] auto-injector is **not recommended for use in children**. Emerade[®] is also available as 300microgram and 150microgram doses. EpiPen[®] and Jext[®] continue to be available in the 300microgram and 150microgram doses.

Please refer to the relevant SPCs for full dosage information for Emerade[®], EpiPen[®], and Jext[®].

Emerade[®] will now be added to the Tayside Area Formulary to provide an option to deliver a 500microgram dose for anaphylaxis.

Costs of currently available auto-injectors for adults (MIMS March 2017): Emerade[®] 300microgram £25.99; Emerade[®] 500microgram £26.99; EpiPen[®] 300microgram £26.45; Jext[®] 300microgram £23.99.

Implementation

Given it is critical that the auto-injector can be confidently administered, a 'mass switch' for those already prescribed another brand of adrenaline auto-injector is <u>not</u> recommended.

Emerade[®] 500microgram dose may be prescribed for adults or adolescents over 60kg (depending on clinical judgement), on a case by case basis after training has been undertaken.

Background to this change

In 2008, the Resuscitation Council (UK) advised that the recommended dose of adrenaline for anaphylaxis to be administered intramuscularly by healthcare professionals in adults or a child more than 12 years of age is 500micrograms intramuscularly (300micrograms if the child is small or prepubertal).

Before the introduction of Emerade[®], only the 300microgram dose of adrenaline was available for self-administration for adults and adolescents. Emerade[®] 500microgram dose provides an option that may be suitable for some patients.

Auto-injectors must be prescribed by brand name. Patients and carers must receive training tailored to the specific auto-injector prescribed.
