Clinical condition	Comments
Campylobacter	No antibiotics usually required. Frequently self-limiting
	If patient is immunocompromised, elderly or has prolonged symptoms consider: clarithromycin 500mg bd for 5 days (7 days if hospitalised with severe disease as per ID advice only) (check for drug interactions)
Salmonella or Shigella	Seek specialist advice
Norovirus, Rotavirus	No antibiotic treatment
E.coli O157/Shiga toxin producing E.coli (aka STEC, VTEC, STX 1/2)	Seek specialist advice as antibiotics may precipitate Haemolytic Uraemic Syndrome

Diarrhoea	Stool sample essential – for PCR, culture and microscopy (including ova and cysts).
