- The FSRH supports any 52 mg LNG-IUD (independent on its licence) to be used:
 - \circ for endometrial protection (as part of HRT or PMS/PMDD treatment) for up to 5 years,
 - \circ for contraception for up to 8 years, or up to the age of 55 IF inserted in patients aged 45 over.
- Any copper IUD containing 380 mm² can be used as emergency contraception.
- Any copper IUD containing 380 mm² can be left in situ till the menopause if inserted at the age of 40 or over: remove 2 years after final period aged 40- 49 or 1 year after final period aged 50- 54. Contraception is not longer needed from the age of 55.
- Devices highlighted in green: devices routinely in stock at Tayside Sexual & Reproductive Health Service.
- Any LNG-IUD can stay in situ for up to 10 years if used to treat period or vaginal bleeding problems, as long as still considered as helpful for this indication. Also consider keeping an expired LNG-IUD (if not replaced) in situ for up to 10 years when a new contraceptive method or a new HRT regime is started, to prevent bleeding issues (Good Practice Point).
